

MINOT SLEEPER LIBRARY TRUSTEES MEETING

MAY 13, 2013

1. Secretary's report accepted.

2. Treasurer's Report:

George reported that \$75,000 has been transferred to the town for construction costs. He stated that we need to resolve final costs. Wendy will be meeting with Michael Capone about this.

The solar project will be completed by the end of July and discussion was held on how to pay for it. We must pay 1/3 up front.

Roger made a motion to authorize the treasurer on or about June 1 to liquate such an amount from the Stock Portfolio to be added to monies from the Capital Fund and Investment Pool to apply toward the cost of the solar panel installation. Archie seconded and the motion was approved.

The capital fund will be closed and future income from bricks will be deposited into the checking account.

Old Business:

Solar panels,

- Vent pipes on roof must be moved to the front of the roof to make run for the panels.
- 12 KW system

- Bids are due May 24
- Installation complete before July 27, will take 3 days
- Roger has agreed to open the building on the days of installation
- Conduit piping will be on outside of the building
- The inverter will be in the mechanical room and must be secured. This room will be locked.

Land: Archie continues to work with the town on ways to abate the taxes on the land on West Shore Road. It appears that we may have to ask the town to accept the land from the friends.

Appreciation Luncheon: Sharon talked with Judy Willson and has set the date for August 20 at the library. She will contact caterers.

Slates: *Archie moved to accept the pricing proposal. Wendy seconded and motion passed.*

Open trustee seats: Two applications were received. *Wendy motioned to accept the applications from Rosemary D'Arcy and Shirley York and recommend them to the selectboard. Barbara seconded and motion was accepted.*

New business:

Sharon reported that the budget line for telephone is -12% at this time. We have 2 Metrocast lines and 1 Fairpoint. We looked at the budget to find places to save money. Sharon suggested that we won't use the computer support because the current contract will not be renewed. There should also be addition funds in the Maintenance/Repairs line. The trustees felt that the funds can be found through savings on other lines to cover the telephone bills.

Sharon reported that the frames are repaired and the portraits of Minot and Sleeper will be returned next week. The frame repair cost \$1,050. *Wendy mad a motion to pay Roger Belsen \$1,050 for the repairs on the frames. Archie seconded and motion passed.*

Rededication program:

Wendy presented the plaque for the Genealogy Area to Barbara. The trustees had voted to name this area of the library for Barbara in honor of the tireless effort she demonstrated for many years to make the library expansion possible.

Roger has printed 150 programs and is making name tags for the trustees.

Other

Barbara brought up the need for the trustees to make a plan for outside landscaping maintenance. Sharon will speak to Brandon Bliss who is working for the Garden Club in the Butterfly Garden to get an idea of what the cost would be. We will create a line item for this in next year's budget.

Lucille suggested that we should apply for NHLTA awards for Library of the Year and the Sue Palamatier Award for Outstanding Support by a "Friends of the Library" Group. Sharon will write the Library of the Year letter and Barbara, Sharon and Lucille will collaborate on the Friends letter.

Archie will write thank you notes to the school for cooperation in painting the slates.

George reported that the Rotary Club is looking for local projects to support. Sharon and Roger will attend their next meeting to present a projector and screen project for the library.
